## LANDSCAPE RESTORATION

If you have been on campus recently, you have seen the big changes to the landscape! The National Park Service is removing invasive species and dead trees, and will be planting native species as the land is restored to a more natural state. The 2019 Summer Camp season was sold out! The new Chellberg Farm Day Camp offered a new option for younger children, ages 5-8.




